INSTALLATION LETTER #47: SUPPORT FOR PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES

Mission permitting, unit commanders will afford Soldiers with school-age children time to attend scheduled parent/ teacher conferences, Individualized Education Program and 504 Plan meetings (physical or emotional disabilities), Behavioral Intervention Planning, Student Services Team and/or Case Study Committee meetings, which may last between one to three hours. Soldiers are expected to attend the aforementioned conferences and meetings when commanders grant duty time for attendance to assist in the educational planning of their child's special needs.



HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR STABILIZATION PROGRAM

The intent of the procedure is to provide stability to Soldiers with Family members in their junior and senior years of high school to avoid disruption of the school schedule. Soldiers should use a DA Form 4187 to request stabilization no earlier than March 1 of the student's freshman year and no later than the start of the student's sophomore year (applying between March and September). Regulatory guidance is contained in Army Regulation 614-200, paragraphs 5-25 and 5-26 for Enlisted soldiers and Army Regulation 614-100 for Officers.



TUTOR.COM FOR MILITARY FAMILIES

The Department of Defense MWR Library Program provide online tutoring AND homework help from Tutor.com at no charge to all K-12 students in National Guard, Reserve, and Active Duty Military Families. Tutor.com allows students to connect to a live tutor online at any time for one-to-one help with homework, studying, test prep, proofreading and more. Access to Tutor.com is free 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, no appointment needed for 40+ subjects, all skill levels and test prep assistance.



IMPACT AID

The purpose of Impact Aid is to provide formula grants to school districts impacted by the presence of non-taxable federal land and military installations. Impact Aid makes up for lost revenues and additional costs associated with the federal presence. Funds that are receive by local school districts go into the general fund to pay for operating expenses just as the local taxes do. Families are provided an Impact Aid Survey each year to complete and return to the school. Each survey is significant to the school district because it can impact the amount of funding received.
